June Regents Exam Schedule

Dear Parents/Guardians:

As we approach the end of the school year, students are preparing to take examinations in a variety of courses. Please find the 2017 June Regents exam schedule on our website: www.corinthcsd.org.

Local and Regents exams will begin on Tuesday, June 13th and will run through Friday, June 23rd. Please note that there will be no regular or BOCES classes during the examination period.

The transportation department will hold usual bus runs in the morning and afternoon. Please note: if your student needs transportation other than the normal morning pick-up or afternoon drop off, he/she must sign up in the high school office so we can inform the transportation department. Sign-up sheets will be available starting Tuesday, June 6th.

It is crucial for students to be punctual and attend school on the dates/times they have exams. Parents can help their children by encouraging them to get a good night's sleep the night before their exam and to eat a good breakfast the day of the exam. For added convenience, breakfast and lunch will be available in the cafeteria through June 20th. NYS's New Excelsior Scholarship

You may have heard the exciting news about New York State's new Excelsior Scholarship. New York's tuition-free degree program is the first of its kind in the nation. Tuition-free college will begin immediately for students whose families make up to \$100,000 annually and extend to those making \$120,000 annually by 2019.

In order to be eligible, students must:

- Be residents of New York State
- Plan to attend a SUNY or CUNY two or four year degree program
- Take 30 credits per year and make progress towards graduation
- Maintain good academic standing
- Be on track to graduate on time with an Associate's Degree in two years or a Bachelor's Degree in four years

Students must apply for this award. Visit www.hesc.ny.gov/excelsior for more information and to sign up for email alerts about when and how to apply. The Excelsior Scholarship application is available now through July 21st.
