NYS's New Excelsior Scholarship

You may have heard the exciting news about New York State's new Excelsior Scholarship. New York's tuition-free degree program is the first of its kind in the nation. Tuition-free college will begin immediately for students whose families make up to \$100,000 annually and extend to those making \$120,000 annually by 2019.

In order to be eligible, students must:

- Be residents of New York State
- Plan to attend a SUNY or CUNY two or four year degree program
- Take 30 credits per year and make progress towards graduation
- Maintain good academic standing
- Be on track to graduate on time with an Associate's Degree in two years or a Bachelor's Degree in four years

Students must apply for this award. Visit www.hesc.ny.gov/excelsior for more information and to sign up for email alerts about when and how to apply. The Excelsior Scholarship application is available now through July 21st.

Notes from the School Nurse

- A Tdap immunization is necessary for school attendance, per NYS immunization requirements, for students entering **6th grade**.
- A Meningococcal vaccine is necessary for school attendance, per NYS immunization requirements, for students entering **7th grade**. A second Meningococcal vaccine is required for students entering **12th grade**, unless the first one was given at age 16 years or older.
- Physicals are required for students entering Grades **K, 2nd, 4th, 7th, 10th**. They are also required for **new enterers to District, for Sports/Athletics, and students being referred to CSE**.
